Dear Parents and Carers,

#### THANK YOU

I want to send out my sincere thanks to all of our community members who have supported us as we have worked through the COVID-19 restrictions in order to provide the best and safest environment for our students and staff. The term started differently than we had anticipated, with schools opening up by Week Three and attendance numbers increasing rapidly to almost 100% this week.

We thank parents for the work they did in keeping teaching and learning happening at home through the use of the resources and lessons that our staff prepared. We also thank you all for supporting us by dropping and picking up students at the gate and by not coming onto the school grounds. The fact that we also did a class restructure during this time, which ran very smoothly, is a testament to our staff and to you for your support.

We hope that as the restrictions begin to lift, we will be able to return to a level of normalcy over the remainder of the year.

#### UNIFORM

Over the past few weeks we have been running a competition to encourage students to wear the correct uniform. This has been a wonderful success and we thank you for ensuring that your child comes to school dressed according to the requirements of our Dress Code. School uniform helps unite our students as one group and ensures that they model a very high standard. This impacts on behaviour and learning. We will continue to run our voucher competition and award prizes to students over the remainder of this term.

#### CARPARK SAFETY

We have been impressed with the way that a majority of parents are using the school carpark. People are usually very considerate of pedestrians and are driving slowly through the space. We remind parents who use the parallel parking spaces to remain with their car at all times and to move forward when they can so as to make parking easier for people coming in from behind. Please remember that double parking is not allowed as it is not safe and it restricts traffic flow. We also ask that parents try to access the carpark in the one direction i.e. enter from the driveway on Elderiana Link and exit at the driveways on Grandis Boulevard. This should allow for a better flow of traffic.

## P&C ACTIVITY

The Department of Education is now allowing P&C meetings to take place for less than 20 people outside of school hours. Our next P&C Meeting is scheduled for 9 June starting at 7.30pm in the Staffroom. The P&C will send out more information about booking a place at the meeting so that we do not exceed the attendance restrictions.

We aim to identify, respond to and support the holistic needs of the Grandis School community through exemplary practices, processes and targeted interventions where every child can achieve their full potential.

Grandis Primary School has a shared vision for all members of our learning community to develop a strong sense of belonging where we are connected and supported. At the heart of our whole school approach to student services, we have strong underlying value for the social and emotional wellbeing of our school community.

G-CARE at Grandis Primary School encompasses the following domains:

- Attendance
- Behaviour
- English as Second Language or Dialect
- Special Education Needs
- Students at Educational Risk-academic
- Student Medical Health
- Wellbeing



Each domain has a sub-policy and specific procedures to support this.

We are extremely fortunate to have our School Psychologist Emme Viney and School Chaplain Amanda Rozbicki, supporting the staff, students and families as an integral part of our G-CARE policy. If your child is experiencing challenges in any of these domains, please speak to their class teacher. We are here to help.

## LOST PROPERTY

Lost property generally doubles in size in the winter months as jumpers and jackets get left behind on the oval, play areas and other places around the school. We would like all students to be RESPONSIBLE for their belongings and put jumpers straight into their school bag, however, we know that this isn't always the case.
