## Principal's Message     Mr Stephen Bevan

### WEEK 3 TERM 4

Dear Parents and Carers,

Term 4 has started smoothly, and it is hard to believe that there are only seven weeks left in the school year!! While Christmas decorations are already appearing in the shops, we are continuing to work hard so that the school year finishes as well as it started. Today is World Teachers' Day so I want to send out a huge thanks to all our teaching staff who go 'above and beyond' to provide the best teaching and learning opportunities for your children.

#### Traffic Congestion

We continue to receive a number of comments and concerns about the build up and flow of traffic during pick up times at the end of each school day. A lot of people have a lot of opinions about this. We are always open to constructive criticism and practical ways that may help reduce congestion and move traffic through safely and quickly. Traffic congestion around schools is common across the state, country and world. It is not going to be fully resolved and there is no magic answer. Safety is always going to be our priority.

What have we done?

- In 2019 we worked with the builder of the school to design and install a kiss and drive area within the carpark. This was not part of the original carpark design, but we thought that it would help with the safer drop off and pick up of students from the front of the school. We could not get this constructed on the road as it was not permitted.
- After a period of trialling the kiss and drive we made modifications to the entry and exit points and traffic direction within the carpark. A plan for this was sent out to parents.
- We also had bollards as well as additional signage installed, and line marking completed.
- Regular reminders about the need for patience and care are sent by the school via SchoolStream every term.
- The school has joined the Your Move program which will help promote events and activities that may further reduce traffic congestion
- Admin staff provide supervision of students in front of the kiss and drive each day. They are not there to direct traffic.

What can you do?

1. If you are in a hurry, come early to secure a parking spot as close to the exit as you can.
2. Reverse your car into the parking spot so that you can exit easier
3. Accept that you will have to wait. You need to be patient. Put some of your favourite music on the radio and sing along.
4. Park in a side street and walk to school.

5. Come a few minutes later when traffic has started to clear.
6. Never park in disabled bays unless you have the appropriate permission.
7. Let people into empty car bays when you can.
8. Let people out of bays who want to exit.
9. Always be kind and considerate even if someone irritates you.
10. Drive carefully and watch out for pedestrians who have right of way.

I have been out and observed the average time it takes for the carpark to clear. Generally, this happens within 15 minutes of the final bell. If people are patient, kind and considerate everyone will get home in a safe and timely manner. Please support us by doing the right thing every day.

### **Student Reports**

Student reports are currently being written by classroom teachers and will be sent home on Wednesday 14 December.

### **Swimming Lessons**

It was wonderful to visit the pool and see most of our students actively engaged in learning how to swim. These lessons went very smoothly due to the excellent planning and organisation of Mrs Pearse. We received many positive comments from members of the public and staff at the pool regarding the behaviour of our students.

### **Cross Walk:**

The cross walk on Grandis Boulevard has been partially completed. Bollards and signage still need to be installed. WA Police are in the process of advertising and selecting a suitable person to employ as the crossing warden. Interested parents/community members can obtain an application form by phoning the Children's Crossing Unit on 6274 8734.

### **Painting**

The eating area in front of Karri Block has been painted. Other areas will be done over the Christmas break. Lines and other graphics have been painted on areas of concrete outside Banksia Block. This has been very popular with students in the Early Childhood area.

### **Sustainability Garden Beds**

Beds have been installed but need to be levelled properly before soil goes in. It is hoped this will be completed in the next couple of weeks.

### **Transportables**

The school will be receiving two new transportable buildings which will help cater for student enrolment growth. These building will be installed over December and throughout the school holidays. They will be placed between Karri and Tuart Blocks.

### **Walking on School Grounds**

Each term staff collect information about specific student behaviours that need to be addressed through teaching and learning activities. One focus for this term will be 'walking on the pavement.' All staff will be looking out for this behaviour and acknowledging or redirecting students when they see this behaviour around the school. We ask that parents support us by reminding their children to walk and not run, ride or scoot on school grounds. We also ask that parents model appropriate behaviour by not riding or scooting on school grounds (this includes in the carpark).


### CHAPLAIN’S CORNER
